TÜRKIYE

EARTHQUAKES

In close collaboration with Rotary, project 1 in Türkiye has supported over 2,000 families affected by the earthquakes in Hatay, Antep Maras, Malatya and Adiyaman. Distributions were carried out throughout March, April, and May. Families received tents, mattresses, blankets, solar lights, bags and hygiene kits. Some vulnerable families also received stoves.



SYRIA

CONFLICT & EARTHQUAKES

In northern Syria, with our partner Bahar, project 1 supported over 990 households in Aleppo area with tents, blankets and mattresses, solar lights, water carriers, tent base construction, and cash assistance. A second project with ReliefAid provided 6,000 blankets and mattresses to new arrivals into displacement camps in Idlib.



PAKISTAN

FLOODING

Working with Islamic Relief Worldwide, project 1 supported 1,200 households in Sindh and Balochistan with tents, tarpaulins, rope, water filters, water carriers, blankets, mattresses, mosquito nets and solar lights. Project 2 contributed to the self-recovery of approx. 5,000 households with cash assistance.



UKRAINE

CONFLICT

We distributed winter clothing, blankets, solar lights and stoves in Kyiv and Chernihiv. Then shelter kits in eastern areas, recently damaged by the war. Project 5 had a wide geographic spread. 6,000 households received: winter clothing, stoves, blankets, solar lights, water carriers and some received sleeping bags.



MALAWI

TROPICAL STORM

In partnership with CARE Malawi, we are looking to pre-position aid items in preparation for next cyclone season.

We are working with CARE and the local government to provide an emergency shelter package which is suitable for the local context.



CAMEROON

CONFLICT/DROUGHT

Project 11 is supporting 9,800 families in the north (refugees, Internally Displaced People and vulnerable populations) with a range of emergency, transitional and durable shelters. We are working with our local partner, Public Concern, who carried out local procurement, delivering a larger range and more specific set of aid packages to affected people in Cameroon.



YEMEN

CONFLICT

In partnership with BCHR, project 2 is providing locally made transitional shelters to Internally Displaced People. The design consists of an iron grid, fireproof thermal insulation, iron panels and corrugated steel sheets. Project 2 will support around 1,415 households, with 915 receiving transitional shelters and household items: mattresses, blankets, floor mats and fire extinguishers.



SOMALIA

DROUGHT

Conflict, climate shocks, disease and poverty have devastated the people of Somalia. With our partner, Juba Foundation, a pilot project supporting 500 drought displaced households is underway. The project focuses on providing a durable shelter solution.

A household item package includes blankets, kitchen sets, solar lights, mosquito nets and jerry cans.



ETHIOPIA

COMPLEX CRISIS

Working with our partner, IOM, we supported 12,000 of the most vulnerable displaced families with mosquito nets, tarpaulins, sleeping mats, blankets, ropes, washbasins, jugs, bags and jerry cans.

This represents a huge scale up on previous projects due to the massive needs in the country.



BURKINA FASO

CONFLICT

Project 4 supported 1,000 newly displaced families with the construction of the durable transitional shelter, known as the 'Sahelian Tent'.

Project 5 is underway and focuses on the construction of improved Sahelian Tents, for around 1,100 newly displaced families.



MOZAMBIQUE

CONFLICT

Project 2 is with our partner CARE, in Cabo Delgado and Nampula. We are providing 3,000 shelter kits and 3,000 family kits to support families living in resettlement sites.

Shelter survival kits will be provided to 3,000 families in hard to reach/ high security risk areas, where they may be cut off from access to basic items.
